

Acre Rosacea

- Chronic inflammatory condition characterized by:
 - i) Flushing
 - ii) Erythema
 - iii) Papule
 - iv) Pustule
- i) Telangiectasias.
- Usually affects the fair-skinned middle aged people.
- Face is affected most.

Pathogenesis → Unknown.

Domedox and Cutaneous vasomotor instability are poorly defined.

Clinical Feature

A/F → Sunlight, heat, alcohol exposure.

Loc → Face (cheek, nose, forehead).

S → Flushing followed by erythema, papulo pustules.

D/D: Acre vulgaris (No sebum on comedone)

GLE, seborrheic dermatitis, photosensitive dermatitis

Investigation → Not required, for GLE.

Complication

① Rhinophyma (Sebaceous glands and soft tissue overgrowth of nose)

② Blepharitis, conjunctivitis

③ Facial oedema

Management:

- Irritants like strong soaps, and alcohol based cleaners should be avoided.
