Second edition - 1881, Many subjects medicine added

Four class of medicines. By W-T. Leind

- ① Thoroughly proved & repeatedly verified
- ② Well proved but lack clinical verification
- ③ Possess only fragmentary pathogenesis
- ④ Derived solely by ab us in morbis

3rd edition - 1888.

- Made to make it as a complete.
- 4 less important remedy (Castor, Euphorbia, Opuntia, Carterium) removed and 5 important remedy (Acetic acid, Crostus, Anguria, Carbolic acid, Valeriana) added.

4th edition - 1896

- Thorough revision to make it complete without addition or omission.
