

Concordance Repertoires

"Concordance" → Word meaning:

- ① State of being in the same heart & mind, harmony
 - ② Arrangement in alphabetical order of important words used by a author in a book.
- It was used first in Homoeopathy By Boenninghausen in BTRP for relation^{ship} of remedies, which was later changed to "Relationship of Remedies" By Allen.

What is Concordance Repertory?

- It is a Repertory based on the alphabetical arrangement of the original symptoms of materia medica without changing them much.
- It is just indexing the original symptom.
- It belongs to the group of "Puritan Group of Repertoires"

Two Repertoires are Available:

- ① Hering's Repertory of Hering's Guiding Symptoms of our materia medica - 1896.
- ② Gentry's Concordance Repertory →

Fowler's Characters of Distinction.

- ① Double thick black \Rightarrow Symptom repeatedly vertical lines (II) verified (brightest mark)
- \Rightarrow Single thick vertical \Rightarrow Symptom verified by black lines (I) curves.
- \Rightarrow Two ordinary vertical lines (III) \rightarrow More frequently confirmed, or if but one confirmed, strictly in character of some signs to be remembered.
- \Rightarrow Perpendicular dotted \rightarrow Observation liner (C...)

T \rightarrow Toxicological extracts.

Sign of hand \Rightarrow Cross reference to related symptoms, disease and condition.

About the author:

Dr. Calvin Burritt Kneer (1847-1940). Graduated in Philadelphia. Assistant to Hering.

He is Swedenborgian (Member of the Church of New Jerusalem).

Works \rightarrow Kneer Rep, Co-editor of 7 volumes of Hering's Guiding Symptoms, Drug Relationship (1936),

Repository of Headache (1894), The Convalescent, Talks, Life, and Times of Hering (1940).

Plan and Construction

- The Order of arrangement or method of classification followed in the compilation is used by Dr. Hahnemann, developed and perfected by Dr. Hering throughout his entire materia medica. The anatomical or regional division into 48 chapters.
- It starts with "Mind and Disposition" and ends with chapter on "Drug Relationship" along with Index of complete localities and terms.
- The organ-wise classification follows Hahnemann's Schema till chapter 34.
Remaining chapters deal with the whole body.

The organ-wise classification follows the following Order:

- Above downwards
- Front with in-outwards
- Functional symptoms to organic symptoms
- First parts then whole body

Salient features of some chapters

- Each chapter is divided alphabetically into sections and divisions.
- ① Mind and Disposition → Abnormal to 200 magnetic, 200 subacute more than Kertsi mind chapter.
- ② Rest, Position and motion → 200
- ③ Attacks and Periodicity → Season, Periodicity
- ④ Time → Afternoon, Noon, Evening etc.

- ⑤ Temperature and Weather → Air, cold, clausi
- ⑥ Tissue → Adipose, Bones, Cartilages, Fibrous, Fluids. Leads to suppuration.
- ⑦ Stage of life and Constitution? Age, constitution, occupation, Habit, size, temperament
- ⑧ Drug Relationship → Antidotes, Colloidal, Complementary, Irinical etc.
- ⑨ Index

How to Work out a Case?

→ This Repository is mainly used for reference purpose not for systematic Repertorization.

→ The repository has the following hierarchy.

So if the totality of the case fits it, then Kneer Repository will be useful.

- ① Temperament and stage of life and constitution

- ② Mind dispositions with concomitants

- ③ Physical generals (Appetite, Aversion, desire, perspiration etc.)

- ④ Complaints with salient features (modalities, concomitants, direction, etc.)

- ⑤ Tissue affinities → Sensation and modality.

Single symptom can also be referred with details which helps in acute care so called short care.

Introduction

- While searching for a complete symptom.

"Constant dull frontal headache, worse in temples, with aching in umbilicus", he was made to compile this voluminous

Repertory".

If we only had a repertory arranged on such lines, it would have been necessary only to letters "U" under Umbilicus, find the desired symptoms".

Plan & Construction

→ In this second meaning of the word concordance is used.

→ Symptoms are arranged alphabetically

Under each chapter:

The six volume have following arrangement

Volume I → Mind & Disposition to Face

Volume II → Mouth to Hypochondria

Volume III → Abdomen to male sexual organ.

Volume IV → uterus to Mammary Gland

Volume V → Voice to Dreams

Volume VI → Neck & Back to Generality and Fevers

- The author has used the Pharmacology of Materia medica without changing it much
- For example → Under Catarrhia few drugs, but under menses many.
- One symptom can be referred in many places.
- This repertory can be useful for reference of any symptom, even a layman can use it. But not useful for systematic repertorization of a case.
