

## Synthetic repository;

- ① \* Hahnemann felt the need of repertory to be published. *Fragmenta de Visibibus* which lead to a revolutionary change and thereafter many repertory published.
- ② \* Although more 200 repertory published Kent repertory was most used because of its completeness, reliability and appropriateness.
- ③ \* He used all the old works but did not incorporate ~~old~~ new symptoms and diseases.
- ④ \* Many practitioners like Boger and Vithoulkar made significant addition to Kent repertory and published as Additions to Kent's repertory.
- ⑤ \* Inspite of this there was a need of better one, so it was made by Dr. Barthel and Dr. Klunke who collected various information and published Synthetic repertory and published in India in 1987 by B Jain Publishers.
- ⑥ \* It was containing information from all the early repertory and so it was most appropriate and reliable of all the repertoires.
- ⑦ \* First they wanted just Supplement Kent repertory due to vast information they could not properly integrate with Kent's repertory. so they published a new repertory called "Synthetic repertory".
- ⑧ \* Synthetic Repertory title was due to three fold synthesis:
  - ① Supplement from oldest to latest homoeopathic literature.
  - ② The register of equivalent and related symptoms.
  - ③ Composition of individual subjects.
- ⑨ \* In the course of work, Dr. Barthel found unlimited symptoms (General and particular), so he decided to publish General symptoms which play important role in choice of drug.

- (10) - He considered Kent's Repertory to be the best reference book for particulars.
- (11) Synthetic Repertory is divided into three volumes.
- Volume I - Mental Symptoms
  - Volume II - Physical Complaints (Except Sex & Sleep)
  - Volume III - Sleep, Dreams, Sex.
- It contains 80 miasms from 16 different books.

### Philosophical background:

- Synthetic repertory is based on Generals. They prepared it only on Kent's repertory they gave importance to generals, though the particulars cannot be neglected.

They faced difficulties with non-availability of general in the existing repertory so they created Synthetic repertory.

As per Homeopathy, man becomes sick only when vital force is deranged. So disease occurs from centre to periphery. So the first expression of changes in the feeling of patient - altering the generals which indicate the correct remedy.

III Volume

Volume I → Mental ~~Gen~~ Symptoms

Volume II → physical Complaints (Except Sleep, Sex)

Volume III → Sleep, Dreams + Male + Female Sexual

Volume I: Contains only mental symptoms, from delusions generally to narrowing down. It has advantages over other repertory documents.

Volume II: It contains physical generals including time and modalities. Desire, aversion, intolerance. Ailments from it are mentioned in almost all rubrics. Clinical conditions like anaemia, Uraemia are included. Pubic pain included.

Volume III - Sleep → Various condition of sleep  
Dreams - various dreams.

Male and Female sexual symptoms  
Menstruation, discharge, Pregnancy.

### Arrangement of Rubrics

The rubrics are arranged alphabetically. The rubrics are arranged alphabetically.

First Volume → Main rubric with large group of medicine followed by rubric like time and modifying factors. Ailments from included

Second Volume → Time does not follow alphabetical order morning, afternoon, night order followed whenever possible side, time, modality order is followed.

Third Volume → Main rubric followed by time and modifying factors.

Cross reference are present throughout the repertory.
