

Acute Rheumatic Fever

- It is the disease that affects the heart, joints, brain & skin.
- It usually affects the childrens 5 to 15 years
- After the infection of STREP THROAT
Post streptococcal β-Hemolytic
Group A → Belongs to Group A
β hemolysis → Streptolysin → β hemolysis
streptococcus →

Pathophysiology

- Delayed immune response
- ↓
Antibodies against streptococci
attacks body's own cells.
(Molecular mimicry theory)
- ↓
Cells react with Cardiac myofibril and Sarcoplasmic membrane.
- ↓
Inflammation of endocardium, myocardium,
pericardium, joints, skin
- Aschoff Nodules are pathognomonic
- They are multinucleated giant cells.
 - They are surrounded by lymphocytes, macrophages.
 - Fibinous degeneration is seen with immune cells and enlarged macrophage showing like caterpillar (Artschowcells)
 - They are not seen until the chronic or subacute phases.
 - It is in inflammation of myocardium.

Clinical features

- Multisystem disorder causing fever, anaemia, lethargy and joint pain after 2-3 weeks.
- of intermittent pharyngitis

Jones Criteria

Major - J - Polyarthritides

O - Pericarditis

N - Nodular subcutaneous

F - Erythema marginatum, prolonged PR interval

S - Sydenham's chorea

Minor: C - \uparrow CRP B - PR interval, AV block

A - Arthralgia A - Anamnisis of Rheumatism, Fever

F - Fever L - Leucocytosis

E - \uparrow ESR

Diagnosis

- 2 major or more
- 1 major or 2 minor, evidence of streptococcal infection.
- Isolated chorea or Pericarditis if all the other symptoms can be ruled out.

Polyarthritides

- Migratory multiple Joint inflammation, of large joints
- Red, swollen and sensitive, acute pain
- They are not permanent.

Pericarditis:

- Mitral valve regurgitation
- Soft mid diastolic murmur
- Carotid Coomb murmur

→ Aortic Regurgitation

→ Tricuspid & Pulmonary are rarely involved

Myocarditis → Aschoff nodules

- Common cause of death, card. contract.

Pericarditis → Pericarditis, chest pain.

Friction rub, Breathlessness

Subcutaneous nodules Erythema Marginatum

- Usually in trunk & extremities, not in face.

- Starts as red macules that fade at the centre and remain red/purp. at edges.

Subcutaneous nodules - Purples, small, firm, present at the extensor surface of the bone and tendons.

- Usually present after 2-3 weeks after the onset, no only confirmation.

Sydenham chorea or St. Vitus dance.

- Irregular, purposeless rhythmic movements of the face, arms, due to

autoimmune reaction of Basal ganglia.

- Comes only after 3 months after the episode and after all the symptoms have disappeared.

Investigation

A SO Justice (Anti Streptolysin O) Titre -

- CRP, ESR, Thromocytes

Echocardiography → Pericarditis, Valve affection

- ECG.

Complication → Chronic Rheumatic Heart Disease

- About 50% of people, Repeated infection → Fibrosis and fusion of valves → stenosis: mitral stenosis, buttonhole stenosis,

→ Regurgitation

→ Infective Endocarditis
